# THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 17th January 2021



As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, "Look, there is the lamb of God." Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, "What do you want?" They answered,

"Rabbi," - which means Teacher -"where do you live?" "Come and see," he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour. One of these two (who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said) was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him, "We have found the Messiah," - which means the Christ - and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, "You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas," - meaning Rock.

One day, John the Baptist was standing with two of his followers when Jesus walked by. John looked at Jesus and said, "Look, there is the Lamb of God, the one who has come to save us." On hearing this, the two men went after Jesus. Jesus turned and said, "What are you looking for?" They answered, "Where do you live?" Jesus said, "Come and see." So they went and stayed with him for the rest of the day. One of these two men was Andrew, and early next morning he took his brother, Simon, to meet Jesus. Jesus looked hard at Simon and said, "Simon, you will now be called Cephas" (a name which means Rock).

What did Jesus reply when the men asked him where he lived? Which word or words stood out for you in the Gospel, and why? What does the picture make you think about?

"Yesterday is gone. Tomorrow has not yet come. We have only today. Let us begin." St Teresa of Calcutta


