THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 21st March 2021



Jesus said, "Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you, most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest. Anyone who loves their life loses it; anyone who hates their life in this world will keep it for the eternal life. Whoever serves me, must follow me; wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour them. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all people to myself." By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

3 Loving God & Each Other

"Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching the little ones how to follow Jesus." *Pope Francis*

Following Jesus includes respecting and caring for those who sometimes may be rejected or neglected. Ask your child if they know what 'to follow someone' means. Who impresses them? Who sets them a good example which they would like to follow? How has that person made things better for someone, for a family, for friends or for your school? It may help your child if you can talk about a person whose example you follow, or have followed.

We can follow Jesus in the simple things we do in our lives every day, and make life better for all the family and everyone around us. In this coming week, how can we follow Jesus, even in little ways? Perhaps you can: be a good listener if someone is sad and wants to share their problems with you; find regular time to pray for others; be kind and generous; go out of your way to support anyone who needs your help.

Dear Lord Jesus, thank you for giving your life for us and for calling us to **follow** you, so that our world may become a better place. Amen.
