THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 4th July 2021



Jesus went to his home town and his disciples accompanied him. With the coming of the sabbath he began teaching in the synagogue and most of them were astonished when they heard him. They said,

"Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him? This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Joset and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?" And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, "A prophet is only despised in his own country among his own relations and in his own house." And he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.


Our Special Time Together

And they refused to welcome and accept Jesus. But Jesus still cured a few sick people before leaving them to go and teach elsewhere.

Wednesday's WELCOME Loving God & Each Other Word is ...

"God's will is that we grow in our capacity to welcome one another." Pope Francis

God lives in everyone. When we are welcoming to others, we are also welcoming to God. Ask your child what the word 'welcome' means to them. When did they last get a warm welcome and how did it make them feel? Who always makes them feel especially welcome? Tell your child about any places where you have been made to feel very welcome and looked after. What was it about the place, or the people there, that made it so special?

"Let us be challenged by Jesus' words and actions, and welcome his call." Pope Francis

Jesus came to help people and tell them about God's love for everyone, but he did not always receive a warm welcome. As a family, talk about how you can welcome Jesus' call to become more like him. Perhaps we can: be kind and loving in your simple everyday words and actions; be peacemakers; tell others about the hope and goodness that God can bring into their lives; be fair and generous with everyone we meet; talk about how we can make visitors feel especially welcome.
