


Reviews

What is a Supported Internship?

The Westminster City Council and Kensington and Chelsea Supported Internship Programme is an accessible work-based training course for young people (ages 16-24) with special education needs and/or disabilities (SEND) who want to get a paid job.

Is this for me?

Yes, if you:

- Are aged 16-24
- Have an EHC plan
- Have entry 1 Level 1 English and maths
- Want to progress into paid work
- Are an independent traveller or could do travel training

How do I apply?
