### NURSERY AND RECEPTION ADMISSIONS

The closing date for Nursery and Reception applications is 15<sup>th</sup> January 2022. A place in the Nursery does not guarantee a place in Reception and even if your child has a current place in the Nursery you must apply separately for a place in Reception. Reception applicants who live in Westminster must also complete a Westminster Common Application Form (CAF) and return this directly to Westminster Admissions department or complete the CAF for their home borough. Applicants will be notified of the outcomes of their applications on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

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### IMPORTANT CORONAVIRUS REMINDERS

As we continue through the pandemic and new variants of coronavirus develop, it is important that we all follow the latest guidance and work together to try to reduce the spread of the virus.

Thank you to everyone who supports the school as this really is a shared effort. Please find below some important reminders of how we can continue to work together to keep our St. Vincent's family healthy and safe.

- Please be vigilant to the symptoms of coronavirus and book a PCR test immediately if your child displays any of these symptoms.
- If your child has been identified as a possible close contact of a positive case, particularly the Omicron variant, please complete daily lateral flow tests to ensure your child is not carrying the infection into school, as they may be asymptomatic.
- Please keep the school fully updated. We would much prefer that parents were honest about contacts, symptoms and test results, and then follow the government guidance, even if this means some absence. The school will also communicate with you about any confirmed cases within your child's class.

As a reminder, the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are:


- a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

However the symptoms of the newer variants present as a common cold so schools have been advised to have a low threshold of suspicion for cases. Some key symptoms include:

- headache
- sore throat
- runny nose
