YEAR 6 LEAVERS As we come to the end of the school year it is the end of an era for our Year 6 children. There are a number of events to celebrate their time at St. Vincent's. On Tuesday 16th July at 19:00 there will be a production to which year 6 parents are warmly welcomed (ticket only) and on Thursday 19th July at 9:15 a.m. there will be a Farewell Mass for Year 6 only followed by morning tea for the families attending. We thank year 6 for their contribution to school life at St. Vincent's and wish them well for their future and their new Secondary Schools. Parents from other year groups or family members who have been unable to secure a ticket are welcome to watch the morning Dress Rehearsal at 10:00 on Tuesday 16th July. Please see Miss Coleman if you would like to attend.

ASTHMA AT SCHOOL

St. Vincent's is an inclusive school with a strong Christian ethos which values the unique worth of every individual. We believe every child has a right to education, irrespective of any medical condition they may have. The school will do everything reasonably and practically possible to ensure that pupil's with medical conditions have full access to the curriculum and all the normal school activities including school trips and Physical Education. Through co-operation with health professional, parents and the delivery of appropriate training the school will develop an understanding of how a particular medical condition impacts on a child's ability to learn, including the social and emotional aspects of having a medical condition. At the same time every effort will be made to increase the confidence and independence of children with medical conditions and promote self-care.

An increasing number of pupils are being diagnosed with asthma and it is really important that the school is fully aware of their condition and can work together with parents to support the needs of the child. The key points below have been complied form guidance by Asthma UK and incorporating the principles of the St. Vincent's Supporting Medical Needs Policy.

- 1. Share responsibility for your child's asthma The lead person for health conditions at St. Vincent's is Miss Coleman, supported by Mrs Lynch and we work very closely with our school nurse, Karen Atkins, who visits the school on Monday mornings. Together with parents we write a Care Plan for every child at our school with asthma. All staff receive training at least annually.
- 2. Book a meeting and share information about your child If your child has asthma or viral wheezing, or needs an inhaler for any other condition such as a virus, please inform Mrs Lynch immediately and make an appointment to speak to Miss Coleman and the school nurse. Talk staff through your child's asthma action plan, and give them a copy to keep. A written asthma action plan explains clearly what to do if your child has asthma symptoms, which can give both you and school staff peace of mind. Explain how asthma affects your child their usual symptoms, and the signs that indicate they may need to use their reliever inhaler (usually blue). You could explain that sometimes symptoms may not be obvious for example, if your child seems sleepy or cannot concentrate, that may be a sign symptoms are keeping them awake at night. Asthma affects everyone differently so the teacher needs to know that your child's situation isn't necessarily the same as that of other children with asthma. Discuss how teachers can let you know if your child has any asthma symptoms at school or has used their reliever inhaler during the day. Ask how the school would prefer to get any updates about your child's asthma.
- 3. Manage your child's medicines The school needs an inhaler and a spacer for your child (we encourage children to use this as it helps make their inhaler more effective, especially in an emergency situation). Make sure your child's inhaler is labelled. Ideally, keep it in the original box with the prescription label, stored with the cap on. Also, check the inhalers regularly to make sure there is plenty of medicine in them, and to make sure they're still in date. Although the school will endeavour to remind you of this, it is ultimately the responsibility of parents. St. Vincent's has Emergency Inhalers in the school office in case a child cannot access their own inhaler for any reason but consent is needed and this is not a substitute for their own inhaler.

If your child needs to take any extra medicines during school hours, please give the headteacher a guidance note from your GP.

4. Plan for emergencies Your child's teacher, and other key school staff, need to know the signs that your child may be having an asthma attack, and when to call 999. All staff understand that your child must not be left alone without an adult present until they are feeling better.

RECEPTION-YEAR 1 UNIFORM A reminder to all Reception parents that your child will be wearing a different uniform from September when they leave the Foundation Stage and start in Key Stage 1. This transition to more formal teaching in Year 1 is marked by a more formal uniform, with a shirt, tie, trousers or skirt and cardigan or jumper. Shoes will be required to be worn; not boots, sandals or trainers. Reception and Nursery children in September continue to wear the same plain tracksuit bottoms and sweatshirt with school logo. To support parents a Second Hand Uniform Sale will be held in the school hall at 15:00 on Tuesday 9th July 2019. Please collect a Uniform leaflet from the school office or check on the school website if you would like further detail or need to clarify any of the uniform requirements.

REPORTS AND PARENTS EVENING

Reports will be sent home on Monday 1st July. These will confirm whether a child is working at the expected standards for their age, with celebration of their achievements this year and details of the next steps for them to continue to make progress. If you wish to discuss the content of the report please inform your child's classteacher and an appointment will be arranged for Thursday 4th July (Nursery, Y1, Y2, Y3, Y6) or Friday 5th July (Reception, Y4, Y5) when Optional Parents Evenings will be held.


