If you have any concerns or need any support please do get in touch and we will arrange a virtual meeting. Although we still need to maintain a physical distance we will continue to work together.



WORKING TOGETHER TO KEEP OUR SCHOOL FAMILY SAFE

You will be aware from our regular emails and website updates, including the regularly updated Risk Assessments and Home School Agreement, of the many ways the school is working to keep everyone safe. We cannot do this alone and need the full support of all families. A reminder is below of the commitment we need form parents and carers in order to ensure a safe and purposeful environment for all. Miss Coleman, Mrs Duffy and Miss Carruthers will be responsible for reminding everyone of these requirements so please do not be offended if we need to speak to you-this really is a team effort! Please remember to:

- only bring a child to school who is well and not displaying any symptoms of Covid-19 or any other illness
- not bring a child to school if any member of the household is displaying any of the symptoms of Covid-19
- act guickly and safely to collect a child from school if they are unwell
- inform the school if a child or family member becomes unwell with symptoms of Covid-19
- if a child show symptoms of Covid-19 to arrange a test as soon as possible and inform the school of the result
- ensure that children attend school wearing their school uniform or their PE kit on the designated day for PE lessons
- ensure that only one adult attends the school to drop off or pick up
- ensure that all adults coming to the school will wear a face covering
- ensure that no adults enter the school building, including not using the school office unless absolutely essential (all communication with school needs to be via telephone or email)
- as is normal practice, parents and carers should be available during the school day in case school needs to make contact (please ensure that we have updated contact details)
- drop children off and pick children up at the specific time given for that year group, to ensure social distancing measures can be maintained, and not congregate outside of the set times
- not mix or congregate with other families at drop off and pick up to ensure minimal contact with those who live outside of the family home
- keep to government guidance when not in school for example not mixing with other households, to minimise the risk of transmission of the virus to our school family

The continued safety of our school family is the priority. Thank you for your continued support.
