





English

- 5 hours of English per week:
 - Writing-all types of texts are covered before May e.g. diaries, letters, narrative, explanation and poetry.
 - Spelling, handwriting, grammar and punctuation.
 - Reading-decode new words, engage in discussions, understand author's intentions, summarizing, 'read between the lines'-predictions, inferences, language (effect on the reader)
 - E.g. Rose Blanche, Holes (Louis Sachar), Treasure Island
 - SPAG
 - Handwriting
 - Speaking and Listening activities

Maths




- 5 lessons per week using Maths no Problem
- Investigations, reasoning, problem-solving, practice of skills and concepts
- Times table challenge-Friday

Reading

- ❑ School- Book club, whole class reading, reading lessons, some individual reading, reading comprehension.
 - ❑ High quality texts e.g. *Goodnight Mr. Tom*
- ❑ All children have class library book if they wish
- ❑ So important that children continue to read at home. Research shows the impact on attainment!
 - ❑ Aim for a chapter book/ novel a week / fortnight
- ❑ Monitor your child's reading
 - ❑ Reading regularly/finishing the book
 - ❑ Range of reading
 - ❑ Appropriate for age-group
 - ❑ Understanding of what they have read
 - ❑ Engaging in discussion



■ Objectives

- Can demonstrate 'web-savvy' awareness, from a range of given scenarios, including conduct, contact and content 'risks' and issues.
- Can discuss range of esafety and esecurity (privacy) issues and knows range of ways to report concerns or inappropriate behaviour.
- Can communicate and collaborate online (such as in school MLE/Wiki /forum), demonstrating respectful and safe behaviours.
- Can check the results of Web searches i.e. how useful, relevant, reasonable, valid, accurate, and appreciates how search results are selected & ranked.


May-July 2019	Research schools (internet/OFSTED reports/schools guides). Talk to year 6 pupils & parents Some tests and interviews will start
July 2019	Meeting for year 5 parents only with Miss Coleman to receive up to date information and check understanding of the application process
July-October 2019	Open days and evenings at secondary schools (and aptitude tests / entrance exams)
October 2019	Meetings with Miss Coleman and Mrs Duffy to discuss choices/complete forms
31st October 2019	Closing date for applications (return of CAF) to 'home LA' <i>Remember 'Back Up' school!</i>
Check carefully!	Closing date for receipt of 'Supplementary Information Form' to each Voluntary Aided school applied for (usually same as for CAF but earlier for places requiring a test).
1st March 2020	Single offer to each LA resident who applied before the closing date.

What is Sayers Croft?

Sayers Croft is a large outdoor learning centre located in the village of Ewhurst, Surrey. It is one of the few remaining 'Camp schools' built in 1939 to provide fresh air and recreation for inner city children and offer a refuge for civilian evacuees in the event of war breaking out.

Sayers Croft began taking groups of children from London on residential visits and in 2003, Surrey County Council declared land at Sayers Croft a Local Nature Reserve.

Sayers Croft provides a wide range of opportunities for first hand outdoor learning in a safe environment.
