
This is a challenging time for many of our school family but we will do all we can to support you. Yours sincerely.

ENTERPRISE WEEK 2020

This year our annual Enterprise Week will be held from 19th-23rd October and has some exciting changes! At the Enterprise Week Launch, each class will be given a loan of £25 to produce a product to be sold. Each class will have to create a name, logo to represent their company and an advert (that will be filmed) for everyone to watch to try and persuade children to buy their products!

Once all classes have watched the adverts, the children will decide what they would like to order and complete online order forms during their lessons. After all the order forms have been completed, it will be time to create the orders! On Friday 23rd October, all the orders will be ready and the children will collect their products.

All products will be £1 and the children may bring in a maximum of £2 to spend.

Through Enterprise Week, we aim:

- To awaken the creative potential of children, providing them with opportunities to generate ideas and make them happen.
- To improve children's using and applying mathematics skills through problem solving in an enjoyable, real-life and meaningful context.
- To promote financial management and enterprise skills for life, such as risk-taking, making financial decisions, managing a budget, being resourceful and taking the initiative.
- To provide children with the opportunity to use their God-given talents and work as part of a team, respecting the contribution that each person has to make.
- To continue to build our learning powers, focusing on reciprocity as we work as a team, resilience as we will not give up even if we face challenge, resourcefulness as we decide how to make out product and finally reflectiveness when we evaluate our products and the processes at the end of the week.

This is a fun week to end the first half term with lots of cross curricular learning opportunities!

UNIFORM REMINDERS

After half term all children must be wearing full winter uniform. For Key Stage 1 and 2 children this means that polo shirts must be replaced by shirts with a tie. Girls may wear plain navy school trousers but not leggings or any trousers with details. For P.E. all children should wear plain navy tracksuit bottoms and a white polo shirt with the school logo.



REMOTE LEARNING PLAN

As you are aware, we have been working on a Remote Learning Plan in case a class or Bubble needs to self-isolate, or there is a local lockdown requiring pupils to remain at home. A summary of this is below and more detail will be sent home next week. Building on our previous experience, we will be moving to the use of Google Classrooms. This will enable daily interaction with their class teachers and the use of video explanations of the tasks by the classteacher. To support those families with limited devices we have purchased Chromebooks that pupils can borrow and today all children have been given their log in and a task to complete so that we can be confident everyone can access the learning platform. Please do try this over the weekend.

However, as much as the technology is essential, we are looking to provide activities that can be completed away from the screen, with lots of reading and written work to be completed in books as well as physical activities that can be completed indoors. The work set will match the school curriculum and will mirror the school day so there is consistency and routine, and it will be easier to return to school after the designated period of remote learning.

Thank you once again to everyone who contributed to our COVID Fund-your donations have benefitted everyone in our school family and helped us to ensure that, if we need to use it, our remote learning offer is ready immediately and addresses the needs of our school community.



HOMEWORK

At present all homework information will be posted on the school website. The English and Maths will be posted as a Home Learning post each half term, with activities to complete in Homework Books and the Wednesday Word is posted a s Whole School Blog. The weekly task will be posted on the Class Blog so that children can upload their work to be shared on the website. Homework is set on Wednesday and needs to be returned on Monday. Reading books are given out on Mondays and need to be returned on Friday (so they can 'quarantine' over the weekend).

More information about your year group's homework can be found on the class pages on the website in the Home learning section. As we prepare for using Google classrooms for remote learning we may use this more for regular homework to ensure that everyone is familiar with this.
