BUILDING WORKS UPDATE

The school website Community Developments page and news feed items record the progress of building projects within the school and in the surrounding area, impacting on the school. A summary is below.

St. Vincent's Second Floor Project

We are really pleased with the improvements to the second floor. The ceilings have been raised, smart lighting installed, electrics upgraded and cupboard space reorganised to be used more effectively. It is now in keeping with the rest of school and a much brighter, open space. The finishing touches will take place during half term. Thank you to the SVPA and Howard de Walden Estate for contributing to the funding for this project.

St. Vincent's Ventilation and Air Conditioning Project

Our governors have secured funding for this project from Concorde, the developers of the Moxon Street Car Park, to ensure that whilst the project is taking place and our windows are closed (to limit the impact of the noise and the dust) our pupils are provided with fresh air and the school is kept cool. The final works will take place during half term.

Moxon Street Car Park

The start date of this project has been delayed and may not be until January 2019. We will inform you immediately once the start date is confirmed. Miss Coleman and the school governors attend regular meetings about this project to try and minimise the impact on the school and to ensure coordination with the others projects in the local area. The great news is that our objection to the affordable housing entrance being moved onto St. Vincent Street was upheld.

Howard de Walden St. Vincent Street Project

As you will be aware, this project has started. Hoarding has been erected on St. Vincent Street and regular communication takes place between the developers and the school to minimise the impact on the pupils. This project is expected to take twenty months to complete.

St. Marylebone Sixth Form Renovations

Unfortunately this project suffered from unexpected delays, hence the scaffolding still being erected in the Foundation Stage Courtyard. However it will be completed by half term and when we return to school after the holidays the scaffolding will have been removed.
