2018 - 2019 Pupil Premium Attainment

100% of Pupil Premium children passed the Year 1 Phonics Screening test

At the end of KS1 100% of our Pupil premium children achieved the Expected level in Reading, 75% achieved the Expected level in Maths and 50% in Writing.

At the end of KS2 100% of our Pupil premium children achieved at least the Expected level in Writing, with 29% reaching Exceeding.

At the end of KS2 86% of our Pupil premium children achieved at least the Expected level in Maths, with 29% Exceeding.

At the end of KS2 86% of our Pupil premium children achieved at least the Expected level in Reading, with 29% Exceeding.

Quality of teaching for all To ensure that all Pupil Premium pupils achieve at least the Expected standard in Writing by the end of KS1 and to increase the amount of children achieving Greater Depth in Writing across all year groups. Interventions happened weekly, with a subject selected for the term. Parents attended regular meetings to discuss progress. Teachers were provided with training to ensure they were aware of targeted / known PP pupils. SENCO and English coordinator delivered staff training to provide teachers with support and strategies to apply in the lessons. During all monitoring sessions from SLT, PP children's books and assessments were monitored. Year 5 and 6 had pupil progress meetings to discuss their progress and decide targets together.			
	Teachers all tracked progress after termly assessment. This was then used to guide differentiation in lessons and and interventions that were needed. Targets were communicated with parents during parents evening.			
	All classes had a full time teaching assistant to support identified children and deliver additional interventions where needed.			

Targeted support To support Speech, Language and Communication needs of Pupil Premium pupils with identified needs.	Selected pupils were able to join the Lego Club. Staff leading the club went on training to help the children to learn key skills and language to support their overall communication skills and vocabulary. After School Hub set up with trained staff to provide targeted support for communication of chosen pupils. Our allocated Speech and Language therapist provided staff with key strategies to enhance communication. Where possible, staff attended SLCN training provided by the Local Authority.

We will ensure: children make good progress, in line with the rest of the school, compared within each cohort in reading, writing and maths; children make attainment in line with National at the end of EYFS (Good Level of Development), KS1 and KS2 (combined reading, writing and maths); children respond positively to support showing a 'can do' attitude and increasing independence shown through school monitoring systems – observation and work scrutiny.
