

My Reception Learning Journey for Reading I am working towards the expected standard for Reception (1) Evidence (date) I can recognise most of the letters of the alphabet. (Phase 2) I am beginning to read some irregular common words. I can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together. I am beginning to read short sentences in meaningful contexts. I can talk about the stories that I have read and heard. I enjoy an increasing range of books. Evidence (date) I am working at the expected standard for Reception (2) ELG: I can use my phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately.
