2017 – 2018 Pupil Premium Attainment

100% of Pupil Premium children passed the Year 1 Phonics Screening test

At KS1 100% of our Pupil premium children achieved the Expected level in Reading and Maths. 75% achieved the Expected level in Writing and 25% Developing.

At the end of KS2 100% of our Pupil premium children achieved at least the Expected level in Reading, with 20% reaching Exceeding.

At the end of KS2 80% achieved at least the Expected level in Writing, with 20% Developing and 20% Exceeding.

At the end of KS2 60% achieved at least the Expected level in Writing, with 40% Developing and 40% Exceeding.

1. Review of previous expenditure

During the previous academic year our Pupil Premium funding was used in the following ways:

- To provide extra support staff ensuring that every class has a classroom teaching assistant.
- To provide unique intervention programmes for underachieving pupils and those with SEND.
- To subsidise residential and other education trips and visits. No child will be excluded from a visit because of financial constraints on the family.
- To provide a range of resources to facilitate learning for specific pupils.
- To ensure all pupils had access to a wide and varied range of extra-curricular activities.

2. Planned expenditure for 2018/19

At St Vincent's Catholic Primary School we use both internal and external data to measure the impact of the Pupil Premium Grant on our pupils' learning. We will review the effectiveness of the interventions we are using and adapt them to meet need when and where required. We will ensure: children make good progress, in line with the rest of the school, compared within each cohort in reading, writing and maths; children make attainment in line with National at the end of EYFS (Good Level of Development), KS1 and KS2 (combined reading, writing and maths); children respond positively to support showing a 'can do' attitude and increasing independence shown through school monitoring systems – observation and work scrutiny.
