PARENT GOVERNOR ELECTION LETTER

I wrote to you on 19th March 2019 to invite nominations for the two parent governor vacancies.

Attached to this letter is:

You may vote for up to two of the candidates. Each parent can submit one ballot paper, regardless of the number of pupils you have attending the school. As indicated on the ballot paper, you should vote by marking an 'X' alongside the names of the parents you support.

Once you have marked the ballot paper you should seal it in the envelope. This should then be put in the ballot box, which can be found in the school hall on **Tuesday 9**th **April from 8:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.**

The count will take place at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday 9th April in the school hall. The election will be decided by a simple majority of votes cast. In the event of a tie, lots will be drawn. All candidates are welcome to attend the count.
