Vocabulary

Equator	A line equidistant from the North and South poles, dividing the Earth into the Northern and Southern hemispheres.
Latitude	Latitude is the measurement of distance north or south of the Equator . It is measured with 180 imaginary lines that form circles around the Earth east-west, parallel to the Equator. These lines are known as parallels. A circle of latitude is an imaginary ring linking all points sharing a parallel.
Longitude	Longitude is the measurement east or west of the prime meridian . Longitude is measured by imaginary lines that run around the Earth vertically (up and down) and meet at the North and South Poles
Climate	The weather conditions in an area in general or over a long period.
Country	A nation with its own government, occupying a particular piece of land.
Continent	any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica).

Important Places

Europe	A continent lying between the Atlantic and Pacific oceans that includes 44 countries.
Arctic Circle	The Arctic Circle is a line of latitude , which is an imaginary horizontal line around the Earth. The lands and ocean north of the Arctic Circle is called the Arctic
River Danube	The second-longest river in Europe, It flows through much of Central and South-eastern Europe, from the Black Forest into the Black Sea.
