





### **St Vincent's Homework Policy**

- > All Homework to be completed in one A4 Homework folder
- Homework is set half termly apart from the creative tasks which are set termly
- All homework will link closely to class topics and weekly skills taught
- Spelling including sentences with a focus on handwriting (test on Monday)
- 1 CGP Comprehension task each week (marked on Monday)
- Mental Maths skills and Mathletics online
- Creative task (now 4 tasks project focus)
- Wednesday word there is a reflection sheet in homework folder to record ideas
- ORT book (record comments on reading record sheet provided)
- Teacher will make a brief comment once every half term for each area of homework set: Reading, Spelling, Maths, Wednesday Word (Religious Education)



## **Reading Books**

- ORT level expectation stage 11 at the end of Year 3.
- Children will continue to follow the Oxford Tree reading scheme to stage 16. Pupils will then become a 'free reader' (not expected until upper KS2).
- Support your child by listening to them read out loud.
- Comprehension retelling, inferences, justifying with evidence, retrieving information, vocabulary. Reading test preparation.
- Regular reading at home will be of great value and support to your child.

#### Handwriting Guidelines and Expectations Year 3

ST VINCENT'S FOLLOW THE NELSON HANDWRITING SCHEME WHICH STARTS IN RECEPTION AND CONTINUES TO YEAR 6. TEACHERS HAVE HIGH EXPECTATIONS OF PUPIL'S HANDWRITING AND PRESENTATION ACROSS ALL SUBJECT AREAS.

Pupils will be taught to:

- Use the diagonal and horizontal strokes that are needed to join letters and understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left unjoined.
- Increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting
- Space letters consistently and keep ascenders and descenders in proportion.
- $\succ$  The idea of writing with a slant is introduced for the first time.

#### How to support your child at home

Encourage your child to practise writing using the diagonal and horizontal strokes that are needed to join letters.

### What you can do to help

- Attendance and punctuality (8:55am)
- Label every item of Uniform! Children now get changed for PE and there is more movement around the school compared to when in Reception so uniform may be misplaced!
- Practise spellings, times tables, handwriting
- Support for behaviour rainbow system
- Early nights
- Daily reading and discussion
- Homework discussion, help given where necessary, time limits set
- Reassurance and praise
- Help on trips (half termly)
- Help children to organise themselves! Encourage independence. i.e. packing school bags, P.E kit, getting dressed independently
