5 <sup>th</sup> November 1605	Gunpowder Plot	
Sunday 2nd September 1666	The Great Fire of London started just after midnight	
Monday 3 <sup>rd</sup> September 1666	People started using fire buckets to put out the fires.	
Tuesday 4 <sup>th</sup> September 1666	St Paul's Cathedral burnt down.	
Wednesday 5 <sup>th</sup> September 1666	The winds died down and eventually the fire stopped.

Renzo Piano	Architect who designed the Shard.
Claude Monet	Impressionist artist who painted pictures of London.
